Key Question: What are celebrations about?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Circle time Talking about emotions and feeling. How can we be a good friend?
- Developing relationships with peers and adults in the setting.
- Continue to follow class rules.
- Importance of perseverance.
- Listening to and responding to instructions from adults.
- Becoming independent in all aspects of selfcare.
- Sharing with others.

Communication and Language

- Circle time Listening to others, remembering discussions and responding to others.
- During Play Using language during role play, negotiating activities etc.
- Take turns when speaking.
- Phonics Oral blending and segmenting activities.
- Continue to learn rhymes and songs. (Christmas)

Physical Development

NUF - Fundamental Movements

- Hopping, jumping, crawling, balancing, throwing and catching.
- Exploring different ways of travelling.
- Listening to instructions and following rules during outdoor play.
- Access to malleable equipment/materials to develop fine motor skills.
- Dough Disco (Fine motor).
- Write Dance (Gross motor).
- Continue to develop good pencil hold/control.
- Continue to develop skills using scissors.

Mathematics

- Representing/mastering numbers I-IO in different ways.
- Counting, cardinality and subitising.
- Counting out a given number from a larger set.
- Calculating one more/ one less than a given number.
- Beginning to recall number bonds to 4 and 5.
- Length and height ordering natural objects.
- Comparing sizes.
- Making Stick Men and comparing sizes.
- Making patterns with shapes / objects.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Bonfire pictures.
- Exploring colours and mixing paints.
- Creating and exploring natural resources to create art. (Forest School)
- Christmas arts and crafts.
- Representative/imaginative play in small world and home corner.
- Sing Up Witch, Witch / Row, Row, Row Your Boat
- Singing and experimenting with rhythm and pitch.

Literacy

- Name writing to form all the letters in their name correctly.
- Continue to learn Phase 2 sounds.
- Letter formation
- Drawing Club.
- CV and CVC word writing.
- Introduce tricky words (sight words).
- To write lists, introduce sentence writing.
- To continue to work on words that rhyme together.
- Story sequencing and developing understanding of structure. To anticipate key events in stories.
- To enjoy reading books relating to Celebrations/winter/Christmas.

Key Vocabulary

- Celebrate, celebrations, birthday, anniversary, wedding, baptism etc.
- Prepare, Advent
- Emotion, emotions, happy, sad, frightened, worried etc.
- Shadows, shade, shape, long, tall, short, wide, small, big, in front, behind light, travelling, transparent, direction etc.
- Hibernate, cold, sleep, hide, store, food etc.

Understanding the World

- Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate times in different ways.
- Discuss past and present events /celebrations of their lives and lives of their families.
- Road safely.
- Talk about keeping safe in the darker evenings.
- Seasons Record changes in autumn through to winter.
- Discuss animals that hibernate.
- Explore objects making shadows.
- Explore light travelling through transparent materials.
- Using different computer programs.
