English

This term we will be using 'It Fell From the Sky' by The Fan Brothers to explore tenses, grammar and vocabulary to produce instructional writing.

- Create instruction through the use of the second person and explore tenses
- Extend simple sentences using conjunctions
- Using imperative verbs to inform and instruct
- Continue to develop use of commas and apostrophes

Our outcome by the end of the term will be to write instructions for a marble game.

Science

Our Science topic this half term is Forces and Magnets. In this unit we will:

- compare how things move on different surfaces
- notice that some forces need contact between 2 objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance
- observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others
- compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials
- describe magnets as having 2 poles
- predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing


Design Technology
