Key Question: What lives under the sea?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- To be able to work and play cooperatively.
- To be able to take turns with others with little adult support.
- To explain the reasons for rules and try to behave accordingly.
- To show independence, resilience, and perseverance in the face of a challenge.
- Prepare for Year One, visit the environment and meet their new teacher.

Communication and Language

- Circle time Listening to and responding to others.
- Listen attentively and respond with relevant questions and comments.
- Give focused attention to what an adult is savina.
- To be able to follow instructions with several parts.
- To play games where they give instructions to each other.
- Discuss what is under the sea.
- How do we look after the environment?
- How do we keep safe near water?
- Recall, use and define key vocabulary.

Physical Development

NUF - Fundamental Movements

- Continue to develop gross motor practice outdoors, crawling, balancing, throwing, catching, jumping, kicking a large ball, and using a bat and ball.
- En joying playing team games together.
- Practice skills for Sports Day running, jumping, egg and spoon races etc.
- Dance and gymnastic sessions in the school hall. Moving/balancing in different ways and responding to music.
- To discuss the effects of physical exercise on their hodies
- Fine motor challenges each week.
- Daily handwriting practice, forming all our letters correctly.
- Continue to develop skills using scissors.

Mathematics

- Count by rote to 100.
- Notice and articulate patterns on a 100 square.
- Use 10 frames to represent numbers 11-20.
- Estimating, addition and subtraction games using 10 frames.
- Adding more using fingers, objects and counting on.
- Recall and apply doubles and halves within 10.
- Recall number bonds to 5 and to 10.
- Continue and create more complex linear patterns.
- Continue to sort 2D and 3D shapes according to their properties.
- Use maps to show and discuss position.
- Regularly use images/videos of number blocks to support learning.

Literacy

- To continue to learn new sounds/tricky words.
- Read texts that match sounds and words learnt in phonics (fully decodable).
- Take part in weekly Reading Practice sessions.
- Name book characters and describe their qualities. Articulate the dilemmas the characters face.
- To form lowercase and capital letters correctly.
- To write short compositions with more than one sentence, capital letters and full stops.
- Daily Drawing Club lessons.
- To use writing in all areas.
- To write facts about the seaside.
- Labelling and writing list of seaside creatures/animals.

Understanding the World

- Seasons Discuss and record changes in the summer.
- Describe differences and similarities between beaches around the world, using photographs.
- Identify differences and similarities between the animals and plants in the beach environment and in the woodland environment.
- Discuss pollution in the water and the dangers to wildlife from man-made rubbish.
- Learn about what is under the sea.
- Investigate floating and sinking.
- Discuss water/sun safety and the role of a lifeguard.
- Look at maps and identify different features on them.
- Make and label their own maps.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Observational drawings.
- Under the Sea themed activities.
- Make junk model boats and rafts, treasure chests.
- Free painting sea creatures.
- Representative/imaginative play in small world and home corner.
- Charanga Music Unit 4 Our World.
- \bullet Sing up Down there under the sea.
- To learn and preform sea shanties and pirate songs.
- Body percussion and instrumental sound effects to tell a story.














Special Events this term
